- (1) Compensation, at a rate determined by the Board, for each day on which the member is engaged in the duties of the member's office; and
- (2) Reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations.
- (d) The Board may employ a staff in accordance with the State budget. 2-205.
- (A) In addition to the powers and duties set forth elsewhere in this title, the Board has the following powers and duties:
  - (1) To adopt rules and regulations to carry out the provisions of this title;
- (2) To adopt and publish [a code] CODES of ethics for the practice of audiology, THE PROVISION OF HEARING AID SERVICES, AND THE PRACTICE OF SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY;
  - (3) To adopt an official seal;
- (4) To hold hearings and keep records and minutes necessary for the orderly conduct of business;
- (5) To issue a list annually of the names of all individuals licensed by the Board to practice audiology, PROVIDE HEARING AID SERVICES, AND PRACTICE SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY; and
- (6) To send any notice that the Board is required to give to a licensee under this title to the last known address given to the Board by the licensee.
- (B) THE BOARD SHALL REQUIRE, BY REGULATION, PERIODIC CALIBRATION OF AUDIOMETRIC EQUIPMENT USED BY LICENSED AUDIOLOGISTS AND HEARING AID DEALERS.
- (C) THE BOARD MAY INSPECT THE FACILITIES USED BY LICENSED HEARING AID DEALERS.

## 2-206.

- (a) (1) The Board shall set reasonable fees for the issuance and renewal of licenses and its other services.
- (2) The fees charged shall be set so as to produce funds to approximate the cost of maintaining the Board.
- (b) [(1)]In accordance with the State budget, the Board may pay expenses incurred in carrying out the provisions of this title.
- [(2) The expenses of the Board and the State Board of Examiners for Speech Pathologists shall be consolidated as a single item in the State budget.]
- (c) The Board shall pay all funds collected under this title into the General Fund of this State.
