

the State Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathologists on the effective date of this Act shall become a member of the State Board of Examiners for Audiologists, Hearing Aid Dealers, and Speech-Language Pathologists for the balance of the term to which appointed, unless the member sooner dies, resigns, or is removed under provisions of law.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any person licensed by the State Board of Examiners for Audiologists, the State Board of Examiners for Hearing Aid Dealers, or the State Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathologists is considered for all purposes to remain licensed for the duration of the term for which the license was issued and may renew the license in accordance with the appropriate renewal provisions of law under Title 2 of the Health Occupations Article, as amended by the provisions of this Act.

SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on October 1, 1992, all the functions, powers, duties, assets, and liabilities of the State Board of Examiners for Audiologists and the State Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathologists of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene and the State Board of Examiners for Hearing Aid Dealers of the Department of Licensing and Regulation shall be transferred to the State Board of Examiners for Audiologists, Hearing Aid Dealers, and Speech-Language Pathologists of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene.

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 272.

This bill would prohibit a mobile home park owner from increasing or imposing a security deposit under certain circumstances.

House Bill 363, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 26, 1992, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 272.
