

(+) (1) REGARDLESS OF WHETHER, BY ITS TERMS OR OTHERWISE, THE GRANT, ASSIGNMENT, OR TRANSFER IS OPERATIVE IMMEDIATELY, OR UPON THE OCCURRENCE OF A SPECIFIC EVENT, OR UNDER ANY OTHER CIRCUMSTANCES; AND

(H) (2) WITHOUT THE GRANTEE, ASSIGNEE, OR TRANSFEREE HAVING TO MAKE ANY AFFIRMATIVE DEMAND OR TAKE ANY FURTHER AFFIRMATIVE ACTION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply to all deeds in existence on or after October 1, 1992.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1992.

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 371.

This bill would extend the termination date of a previously enacted Act of the General Assembly concerning insurance coverage of treatment for acute mental illnesses and emotional disorders.

House Bill 1044, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 26, 1992, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 371.
