Chapter 843 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1986, as amended by Chapter 552 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1989, as amended by Chapter 300 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1991

Section 3

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

**Chapter 843 of the Acts of 1986, as amended by Chapter 552 of the Acts of 1989, as amended by Chapter 300 of the Acts of 1991**

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1986. ~~It shall remain effective for a period of 6 9 years and, at the end of June 30, 1992 1995, and with no further action required by the General Assembly, Sections 354D(a), 470E(a), and 477E(a) of Article 48A of the Annotated Code of Maryland as enacted by this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect. On July 1, 1992 1995, Sections 354D(a), 470E(a), and 477E(a) of Article 48A of the Code as enacted by this Act shall be revived and the Michie Publishing Company shall include Sections 354D(a), 470E(a), 477E(a) as these sections existed before July 1, 1986, but inclusive of all other changes enacted by the General Assembly after 1986 to Sections 354D(a), 470E(a), and 477E(a) of Article 48A of the Code.~~

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1992.
