#### Senate Bill No. 389

### AN ACT concerning

## Education - Blind and Visually Impaired Students Persons - Literacy

FOR the purpose of requiring the use of a certain presumption consideration in the development of individualized education programs for blind and visually impaired children; prohibiting the denial of an opportunity for certain instruction in braille reading and writing under certain circumstances; authorizing the provision of certain reading and writing media to certain children under certain circumstances; making a certain exception; authorizing the provision of alternative media instruction under certain circumstances without prejudice to certain rights of certain individuals; requiring the Professional Standards and Teacher Education Board and the State Board of Education to develop certain standards; requiring the State Department of Education to develop certain procedures; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the establishment of certain literacy rights of blind and visually impaired students in public schools in the State.

FOR the purpose of establishing the Blind Student's Literacy Rights and Education Act; creating a presumption that proficiency in certain skills is essential to the literacy of blind and visually impaired students; providing for strengthening requirements in certain skills for candidates for certification or recertification; providing for the coordination of teaching materials in nonvisually accessible media; and generally relating to the education of blind students.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
