S.B. 500 VETOES

To apply for licensure, an applicant shall:

(1) Submit an application to the Board on the form that the Board requires;

- (2) (I) SUBMIT VERIFICATION FROM THE APPLICANT'S EMPLOYER OR SUPERVISOR ON FORMS REQUIRED BY THE BOARD THAT THE APPLICANT HAS SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED A SANITARIAN-IN-TRAINING PROGRAM; OR
- (II) PROVIDE INDEPENDENT WRITTEN VERIFICATION FROM THE APPLICANT'S EMPLOYER OF ANY PRIOR WORK EXPERIENCE IN THE FIELD OF ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH USED BY THE APPLICANT TO SATISFY THE SANITARIAN-IN-TRAINING REQUIREMENT OF THIS TITLE; and
- [(2)](3) Pay to the Board the required application and examination fee set by the Board.

- (a) To qualify for licensure under this title, an applicant shall meet the requirements of this section.
- [(b) An environmental sanitarian registered by the Board on July 1, 1987 will be licensed for the term of the current registration.
- (c) An applicant employed as an environmental sanitarian on or before June 30, 1985, and who is not registered by the Board, may be licensed if the applicant:
- (1) (i) Has graduated from an accredited college or university with a baccalaureate degree in environmental science or environmental health; and
- (ii) Has obtained 12 months of experience in the field of environmental health acceptable to the Board; or
- (2) (i) Has graduated from an accredited college or university with a baccalaureate degree in the physical, biological, or environmental sciences including a minimum of 60 semester credit hours or the equivalent quarter credit hours of physical, biological, or environmental sciences acceptable to the Board; and
- (ii) Has obtained 12 months of experience in the field of environmental health acceptable to the Board; or
- (3) (i) Has graduated from an accredited college or university with a baccalaureate degree that includes a minimum of 30 semester credit hours or the equivalent in quarter units of physical, biological, or environmental sciences acceptable to the Board; and
- (ii) Has obtained 24 months of experience in the field of environmental health acceptable to the Board; or
