Preamble

WHEREAS, The Joint Committee on Health Care Cost Containment and the Joint Committee on the Medical Assistance Program have each done exemplary work in their respective areas; and

WHEREAS, Economic conditions now require a broader and more comprehensive approach to health care delivery in Maryland; and

WHEREAS, The State's ability to continue funding the Medical Assistance Program is being jeopardized by the combination of new federal mandates and increased program enrollment due to the recession; and

WHEREAS, 1 of every 10 persons in Maryland is now in the Medicaid Program; and

WHEREAS, More than 500,000 Marylanders have no health benefits of any kind; and

WHEREAS, More than half of these uninsured Marylanders are employed full-time, earning in excess of \$20,000, with the majority working in businesses with fewer than 50 employees; and

WHEREAS, Recent budget reductions have necessitated the elimination of coverage of hospital care for the General Public Assistance population; and

WHEREAS, Maryland's unique all payor system has provided unparalleled access to hospital care for all Marylanders but may become overly stressed by the increasing levels of uncompensated care; and

WHEREAS, There is agreement among both payors and providers that maintaining Maryland's Medicare waiver should be one of our highest priorities; and

WHEREAS, It is critical that we understand the relationship between health care cost, quality, and access and develop a strategy to maximize our health care resources; and

WHEREAS, The General Assembly needs a forum to comprehensively consider and study the entire health care delivery and financing system in Maryland; and

WHEREAS, A forum comprised of legislators from different committees would provide the opportunity for dialogue between the standing committees with diverse jurisdictions impacting on the health care system; and
