S.B. 674 VETOES

- 1. THE MAJORITY OF THE STOCK IS OWNED OR CONTROLLED BY A CORPORATION WHOSE STOCK IS AUTHORIZED BY THE SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION OF THE UNITED STATES FOR SALE;
- 2. A LICENSEE IS A RESIDENT OPERATOR OF THE BUSINESS TO BE CONDUCTED UNDER THE LICENSE AND IS RESPONSIBLE FOR DAILY OPERATIONS: AND
- 3. EACH LICENSEE IS AN OFFICER OF THE CORPORATION.
- (II) THE RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT APPLICABLE WHEN A LICENSE IS ISSUED TO AN APPLICANT UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH APPLIES AS LONG AS THE LICENSE IS IN EFFECT.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1992.
