In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 736.

This bill would require the clerk of the circuit court for Baltimore County to include in each entry in a land record index property identifiers.

House Bill 1414, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 5, 1992, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 736.

**Senate Bill No. 736**

AN ACT concerning

**Baltimore County Land Recordation – Indexes – Required Information**

FOR the purpose of requiring the clerk of the circuit court for Baltimore County to include in each entry in a land record index ~~a description of the property that is the subject of the entry; requiring a description of property under this Act to contain certain information; requiring instruments presented for recording in Baltimore County to contain certain information~~ certain property identifiers; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to the indexing of land records in Baltimore County.

BY adding to

Article – Real Property

Section 3-502 to be under the amended subtitle “Subtitle 5. Miscellaneous Recordation and Indexing Rules”

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
