- (ii) Identify other toxic substances contained in packaging that should be added to the list under this Act in order to further reduce the toxicity of packaging waste;
- (iii) Recommend whether to continue the recycling exemption provided under this Act; and
- (iv) Describe the substitutes that manufacturers and distributors have used in packaging and packaging components in place of lead, cadmium, mercury, and hexavalent chromium.

SECTION 3. 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1992.

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 1356.

This bill would authorize local governments to establish a revenue reserve account, require that an ordinance or local law establishing a revenue reserve account include certain provisions, and require funding for a revenue reserve account.

Senate Bill 618, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 12, 1992, accomplishes substantially the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 1356.

AN ACT concerning

County Government - Revenue Reserve Accounts

FOR the purpose of authorizing certain local governments to establish a revenue reserve account for certain purposes; requiring that an ordinance or local law establishing a revenue reserve account include certain provisions; requiring that funding for a revenue reserve account be based in a certain manner; providing for the application of this Act; making provisions of this Act severable; defining a certain term; and generally relating to the establishment of revenue reserve accounts.
