

IN WASHINGTON COUNTY, THE CLERK MAY NOT ENDORSE A CHANGE IN THE PLACE OF BUSINESS UNTIL THE LICENSEE MEETS THE ZONING REQUIREMENTS OF § 17-302(D) OF THIS SUBTITLE FOR A LICENSE ISSUED FOR THE FIRST TIME.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 56, § 6 and, as it related to the transfer of a license, § 12A(b).

In subsection (b) of this section, the former reference to a "designated agent" is deleted as unnecessary in light of the implicit authority of the zoning commissioner to delegate this duty.

17-308. DEATH OF LICENSEE.

IF A LICENSEE DIES, THE SURVIVING SPOUSE OR PERSONAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE LICENSEE MAY DO BUSINESS UNDER THE LICENSE FOR THE REST OF THE TERM OF THE LICENSE.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 56, § 7.

The words "surviving spouse" are substituted for the former words "widow" and "surviving husband" for brevity.

The term "personal representative" is substituted for the former words "executor" and "administrator" for brevity and to conform to language used in the Estates and Trusts Article.

GENERAL REVISOR'S NOTE TO SUBTITLE:

Former Art. 56, § 5, which provided that a partnership may obtain a license, is deleted as an unnecessary general statement of partnership law.

Former Art. 56, § 94, which provided that a license may be revoked for operating or being connected with a place of prostitution or assignation, is deleted as obsolete because it has not been used for at least 20 years. Article 27 of the Code provides criminal sanctions against operating a place of prostitution. Former Art. 56, §§ 96, 97, and 98, which provided for commencement of revocation proceedings under former § 94 and the right to a hearing, that a new license may not be issued for 6 months, and for judicial review, are also deleted as obsolete and unnecessary.
