#### 17-1024. GENERAL PENALTY.

EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE SPECIFICALLY PROVIDED IN PART III OF THIS SUBTITLE, A PERSON WHO VIOLATES PART III OF THIS SUBTITLE IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND, ON CONVICTION, IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$100.

#### GENERAL REVISOR'S NOTE TO SUBTITLE:

Throughout this subtitle, the concept of residency is retained only if it is relevant to the provision being revised. Therefore, former references to a "resident" junk dealer or scrap metal processor, "resident" junk dealer's or scrap metal processor's agent, "nonresident" junk dealer or scrap metal processor, and "nonresident" junk dealer's or scrap metal processor's agent are deleted when appropriate. For example, residency is irrelevant to the concept of what activities a person engages in that trigger the requirement for a junk dealer or scrap metal processor license. Thus, § 17-1006(a)(1) of this subtitle is revised without reference to a "resident" junk dealer or scrap metal processor. Residency, however, is relevant to the amount of the license fee and to certain activities that a junk dealer or scrap metal processor is authorized to engage in. Thus, §§ 17-1007(2) and 17-1010 of this subtitle distinguish between resident and nonresident junk dealers or scrap metal processors. If the concept of residency is relevant, it has been retained in the revision.

Also throughout this subtitle, references to "scrap metal" and "scrap metal processing", respectively, are retained in the revision at the request of representatives of the scrap metal processing industry.
