- (2) \$10 FOR EACH PLACE OF BUSINESS IN A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION WITH A POPULATION OF 5,000 TO 9,999;
- (3) \$15 FOR EACH PLACE OF BUSINESS IN A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION WITH A POPULATION OF 10,000 OR MORE; OR
  - (4) \$40 FOR EACH PLACE OF BUSINESS IN BALTIMORE CITY.
  - (B) NONRESIDENT APPLICANTS.

AN APPLICANT FOR A PLUMBER'S LICENSE WHO IS INCORPORATED OR HAS ITS PRINCIPAL OFFICE IN ANOTHER STATE SHALL PAY TO THE CLERK THE FEE IMPOSED IN THAT STATE ON A SIMILAR NONRESIDENT BUSINESS IF THAT FEE IS HIGHER THAN THE APPROPRIATE LICENSE FEE UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 56, § 179(c) and, as they related to the amount of license fees. (a) and (b).

In subsection (a)(1), (2), and (3) of this section, the references to a "municipal corporation" are substituted for the former references to "cities or towns" to conform to Md. Constitution Art. XI-E.

The Business Regulation Article Review Committee notes, for consideration by the General Assembly, that this scheme does not provide for licensing plumbers or gas fitters with places of business outside of municipal corporations.

## SUBTITLE 16. RESTAURANTS.

17-1601. "RESTAURANT LICENSE" DEFINED.

IN THIS SUBTITLE, "RESTAURANT LICENSE" MEANS A LICENSE ISSUED BY THE CLERK TO OPERATE A RESTAURANT OR OTHER EATING PLACE.
