

[(g-1) (1)] (4) (i) In this [subsection] PARAGRAPH, [the term] "guest" means persons whose names and addresses appear on the registry that is maintained by the establishment. IT

[(ii) The term "guests"] does not include persons who are registered solely for the purpose of obtaining alcoholic beverages.

[(2)](II) The Harford County Liquor Control Board may issue a 7-day special Class B (inn) on-sale beer and light wine license.

[(3)](III) To qualify for this license the applicant's establishment shall:

[(i)] 1. Be an historic structure;

[(ii)] 2. Be approved by the appropriate governing authority to operate as an inn;

[(iii)] 3. Have a minimum of 4 rooms but no more than 10 rooms, excluding the resident management quarters, which the public, for consideration, may use for sleeping accommodations for a specified period of time;

[(iv)] 4. Have a seated dining capacity of not more than 40; and

[(v)] 5. Have a kitchen facility that has been approved by the local governing authority.

[(4)](IV) The holder of a 7-day special Class B (inn) license may sell only in conjunction with a meal beer and light wine to guests for consumption on the premises during the days and hours established for a Class B on-sale beer and wine license for Harford County under this article.

[(5)](V) The annual fee for a 7-day special Class B (inn) license is \$950.

[(6)](VI) The Harford County Liquor Control Board may adopt additional regulations consistent with this subsection.

[(7)](VII) If an establishment ceases to be operated as an inn, the 7-day special Class B (inn) license shall be void.

[(8) (i)] (VIII) 1. The special Class B (inn) license also authorizes the holder to keep for sale and sell beer, wine, and liquor for on-premises consumption during catered events that are catered by the licensee at the inn establishment if the licensee is under contract to cater the event.

[(ii)] 2. Food shall be served at all catered events where alcoholic beverages are provided or sold.

[(iii)] 3. The Liquor Control Board shall adopt regulations to ensure that the primary purpose of the special Class B (inn) license is to permit the licensee to operate as an historic inn.
