- [(5)](V) On Sunday, the holder is authorized under the license to sell:
- [(i)] 1. Beer, wine and liquor for consumption on-premises to a customer:
- [1.] A. If the customer is seated at a table and not at a bar or on a bar stool;
- [2.] B. If the alcoholic beverage is a supplement to the customer's meal; and
- [3.] C. If the total price of the alcoholic beverage does not exceed the total price of the meal; and
  - [(ii)]2. Only beer and light wine for consumption off premises.
- [(p-1)(1)] (2) (I) In this subsection, the word "guest" means a person whose name and address appears on the registry that is maintained by the establishment and who is an occupant of a sleeping room in the establishment. The word "guest" does not include a person who is registered solely for the purpose of obtaining alcoholic beverages.
- [(2) (i)] (II) 1. The [Kent County] Board of License Commissioners may issue a 7-day special Class B (bed and breakfast) on-sale beer, wine and liquor license.
- [(ii)]2. To qualify for a license under [subparagraph (i)] SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH 1 of this paragraph, the applicant's establishment shall:
- [1.] A. Be licensed by the County to operate as a bed and breakfast establishment; and
- [2.] B. Have a maximum of 3 rooms, excluding the resident management quarters, which the public, for consideration, may use for sleeping accommodations for a specified period of time.
- [(iii)] 3. A holder of a 7-day special Class B (bed and breakfast) license may sell beer, wine, and liquor to guests for consumption on the premises during the days and hours established for a Class B on-sale restaurant beer, wine and liquor license for Kent County under this article.
  - [(iv)] 4. The annual fee is \$350.
- [(v)]5. The Board of License Commissioners may adopt additional regulations consistent with this subsection.
- [(vi)] 6. If the establishment ceases to be operated as a bed and breakfast, the license is void.
- [(3) (i)] (III) 1. The [Kent County] Board of License Commissioners may issue a 7-day special Class B (country inn) on-sale beer, wine and liquor license.
