(a) (4) (i) Except for the Class B Sunday off-sale license prohibition in the 47th [legislative] ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES district in Baltimore City as provided for in [§ 19(c-1)] § 19(D) of this article, in Baltimore City and Baltimore County, a Class B and a Class C beer and light wine or beer, wine and liquor licensee may sell alcoholic beverages at a bar or counter on Sunday.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this subtitle, [it shall be lawful] in Caroline County [for any Class B and C beer licensee, any Class H beer and light wine licensee, any seven-day Class B beer, wine and liquor licensee, and any Class C beer, wine and liquor licensee, to] THE FOLLOWING LICENSEES MAY sell alcoholic beverages between the hours of 12 o'clock midnight and 2 o'clock a.m. and between 12 o'clock noon and 12 o'clock midnight on Sunday:

- (1) CLASS B AND C BEER;
- (2) CLASS H BEER AND LIGHT WINE;
- (3) CLASS B BEER, WINE AND LIQUOR (7 DAY); AND
- (4) CLASS C BEER, WINE AND LIQUOR .

(d) Notwithstanding the provisions of § 114 or of any other contrary provisions of this article, the possession of alcoholic beverages upon the premises of a licensee under the provision of this article is not unlawful under any of the following conditions:

(3) When the alcoholic beverages have been brought upon the premises of a [race track] RACETRACK licensed under the provisions of Article 78B of this Code, and the track is licensed for the sale of alcoholic beverages under this article. [, so long as the alcoholic beverages under this article, so long as] HOWEVER, IT IS LAWFUL IF the alcoholic beverages have [not] been furnished by the licensee.
