- (a) Except as provided in subsections (b), (c), and (d) of this section, the State of Maryland hereby preempts the rights of any county, municipal corporation, or special taxing district whether by law, ordinance, or regulation to regulate the purchase, sale, taxation, transfer, manufacture, repair, ownership, possession, and transportation of the following:
  - (1) Handgun, as defined in Art. 27, § [36F(a)] 36F(B);
  - (2) Rifle, as defined in Art. 27, [36F(a)(2)] 36F(D);
  - (3) Shotgun, as defined in Art. 27, § [36F(a)(5)] 36F(G); and
  - (4) Ammunition and components for the above enumerated items.

No person shall manufacture, sell or offer for sale, or order or permit any employee or other person to sell or offer for sale either at wholesale or retail, any malt extract, beer, porter, ale or stout unless the same shall have been brewed and fermented as such; and any person or corporation or officer or agent thereof violating this provision, or any person or corporation or officer thereof selling or offering for sale, or ordering or permitting any employee or other person to sell or offer for sale any beer (to which coloring matter or [porteine] PORTERINE has been added) representing the same to be malt extract or porter or other beverage, or any malt or spirituous liquor other than by its proper name, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and punished by imprisonment for not longer than one year, or by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars, or by both fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court having jurisdiction.
