- (a) A person is guilty of a sexual offense in the first degree if the person engages in a sexual act[:
- (1) With] WITH another person by force or threat of force against the will and without the consent of the other person[,] and:
- [(i)] (1) Employs or displays a dangerous or deadly weapon or an article which the other person reasonably concludes is a dangerous or deadly weapon; or
- [(ii)](2) Inflicts suffocation, strangulation, disfigurement, or serious physical injury upon the other person or upon anyone else in the course of committing the offense; or
- [(iii)] (3) Threatens or places the victim in fear that the victim or any person known to the victim will be imminently subjected to death, suffocation, strangulation, disfigurement, serious physical injury, or kidnapping; or
- [(iv)] (4) The person commits the offense aided and abetted by one or more other persons; or
- [(v)](5) The person commits the offense in connection with the breaking and entering of a dwelling house.
