- (2) [Shall be subject] SUBJECT to any other equitable or remedial relief as a court may deem appropriate, including removal of the administrator that committed the violation.
- (b) In addition to any liability which an administrator may have under subsection (a) of this section, the administrator shall be liable for a breach of responsibility under this subtitle by another administrator with respect to the same plan if:
- (2) By the administrator's failure to comply with [§ 666] § 686 of this subtitle, the administrator has enabled the other administrator to violate this subtitle; or 696.

A person who would be an administrator subject to this subtitle but for the exemption under [ $\S 661(b)(2)(iv)$ ]  $\S 681(B)(2)(IV)$  of this subtitle shall provide:

- (1) Written notice to the Commissioner of operations within this State; and
- (2) Evidence satisfactory to the Commissioner that the person is complying with any applicable bonding requirements imposed by ERISA.

- (g) (1) In accordance with its regulations, the Commission shall review any findings, [conclusions] CONCLUSIONS, or orders issued under subsection (f) of this section and issue a final order.
- (2) If no timely appeal of the findings, [conclusions] CONCLUSIONS, or orders issued under subsection (f) of this section is filed with the Commission in accordance with its regulations, the findings, [conclusions] CONCLUSIONS, or orders issued by the administrative law judge under subsection (f) of this section shall become a final order of the Commission.
