(b) (1) In order to be considered by the foundation, an application to sell shall:

[(1)](I) Be received by the board not later than July 1 for the first offer cycle or January 1 for the second offer cycle of the fiscal year in which the application is to be considered;

[(2)](II) If the applicant intends to seek reimbursement for appraisals required to determine State easement value, include an appraisal that conforms to guidelines established by the Department of General Services by an appraiser approved by the Department of General Services;

[(3)](III) Include an asking price at which the owner is willing to sell an easement; and

[(4)](IV) Include a complete description of the subject land.

(2) NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE FOUNDATION MAY ELECT, FOR FISCAL YEARS 1992 AND 1993 ONLY, TO HAVE ONE OFFER CYCLE.

(d) The Secretary may certify plants to be apparently free of injurious viruses, and/or other diseases, or plants that conform to established standards of strain purity. Each plant producer shall pay the Secretary the following certification fee for each acre, or part of an acre, in plant production: strawberry plants, "Cape" American beachgrass, "Avalon" Saltmeadow cordgrass, [\$50] \$50; grape vines, fruit trees, and bramble plants, \$70. All fees collected shall be placed in the Plant Protection Fund and used to defray partially the cost of virus indexing, inspection, and analysis of plants certified or tagged.
