

Also in subsection (a) of this section, the former words "direction" and "management" are deleted in light of the word "control".

Also in subsection (a) of this section, the former phrase "by any person, club, corporation or association" is deleted as surplusage.

Subsections (b)(2) and (3) and (c)(3), (4), and (5) are revised as powers and duties of the Commission, rather than powers and duties of the secretary to the Commission, since that position is obsolete. See the General Revisor's Note to this subtitle.

In subsection (b)(1) of this section, the word "may" is substituted for the former words "shall ... make ... as they deem expedient" since the General Assembly apparently intended to allow the Commission to use its discretion in adopting regulations to administer its office.

In subsection (d)(1) of this section, the date of "June 30" is substituted for the former date of "June 1st" to conform to the State fiscal year, which since 1966 has started on July 1 and ended on the following June 30. See SF § 2-101 and Ch. 825, Laws of 1963. Since the former June 1 date was enacted by Ch. 710, Acts of 1920, this substitution also conforms to the rule of construction for two conflicting statutes, i.e., the statute whose relevant substantive provisions were enacted most recently is held to have repealed by implication any conflicting provisions of the earlier statute. Farmers & Merchants Bank v. Schlossberg, 306 Md. 48, 61 (1986).

In subsection (d)(1)(i) of this section, the former word "full" is deleted as unnecessary in light of the phrase "of its proceedings". Similarly, in subsection (d)(1)(ii) of this section, the former word "full" is deleted in light of the words "all receipts".

Former Art. 56, § 112AB(d), which stated that "[e]very license shall be subject to the regulations of the Commission", is deleted as an unnecessary statement of the obvious in light of subsection (c)(2) of this section, which requires the Commission to adopt regulations to carry out this subtitle and Subtitle 3 of this title.
