the State Treasurer and the proceeds of the loan equal to the amount of the matching fund shall be expended for the purposes provided in this Act. If this evidence is not presented by June 1, 2000, the proceeds of the loan shall be applied to the purposes authorized in Section 8–129 of the State Finance and Procurement Article. The proceeds of any amount of the loan in excess of the matching fund certified by the Board of Public Works shall also be applied to the purposes authorized in Section 8–129 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Chapter 125 of the Acts of 1985

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:

(1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the General Construction Loan of 1985 in the aggregate principal amount of [\$83,597,000] \$82,883,636. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance and sale of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 19 to 23 of Article 31 of the Code.

Chapter 286 of the Acts of 1986

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:

(1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the General Construction Loan of 1986 in the total principal amount of [\$90,627,000] \$89,434,492. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8–117 through 8–124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, § 22 of the Code.
