

(iii) In Wicomico County a statement that the applicant consents to the Board investigating the applicant's criminal record[.]; AND

(iv) 1. In Prince George's and Worcester Counties, a signed statement by the applicant that the applicant has not been convicted of a felony or if the application is being made for the use of a corporation, that the applicant and none of the stockholders of that corporation have been convicted of a felony; [and]

2. In Worcester County, that the owner of the corporation has not been convicted of a felony; AND

3. IN CHARLES COUNTY, A SIGNED STATEMENT BY THE APPLICANT THAT THE APPLICANT HAS NOT BEEN CONVICTED OF A FELONY, OR, EXCEPT FOR AN APPLICANT FOR A CLASS B BEER, WINE AND LIQUOR (BLX) LUXURY RESTAURANT LICENSE, IF THE APPLICATION IS BEING MADE FOR THE USE OF A CORPORATION, THAT THE APPLICANT AND NONE OF THE STOCKHOLDERS OF THAT CORPORATION HAVE BEEN CONVICTED OF A FELONY;

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1998.

CHAPTER 263

(House Bill 718)

AN ACT concerning

Charles County State's Attorney - Salary

FOR the purpose of altering the salary of the Charles County State's Attorney; ~~specifying that the salary shall be based upon a percentage of the salary of a District Court of Maryland judge; and providing that this Act does not apply to the salary or compensation of the incumbent Charles County State's Attorney~~ specifying that the salary shall be based on a certain percentage of the salary of a judge of the District Court; repealing a certain restriction on the salary of the deputy State's Attorney; and providing that this Act may not be construed to increase or diminish the salary or compensation of an incumbent State's Attorney during the State's Attorney's term of office.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
