SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- (q) In Prince George's County:
 - (1) (i) The State's Attorney's annual salary shall be:
 - **£1.** \$98,000 \$107,775 for calendar year 1995 1999;
 - 2. \$98,000 \$107,775 for calendar year \$98,000 \$107,775
 - **{3.} 1. \$101,000 \$111,000** for calendar year **1997 2001**;

- [4.] 2. \$104,000 \$114,300 for calendar year 1998 2002 [4] and for each subsequent calendar year.]; AND
 - 3. \$115,000 FOR CALENDAR YEAR 1000.
- (II) IN CALENDAR YEAR 2000, AND IN EACH SUBSEQUENT CALENDAR YEAR, THE STATE'S ATTORNEYS SALARY SHALL BE INCREASED BY 4% ABOVE THE AMOUNT FOR THE PREVIOUS CALENDAR YEAR.
- **E(ii)**I(III)** The State's Attorney may not, except in connection with duties as State's Attorney, appear as counsel or represent any party professionally before any court, board, commission, or agency of this State or any county or political subdivision of this State. The State's Attorney may not engage in the private practice of law but may participate in the pro bono program administered by the Prince George's County Bar Foundation.
- (2) The State's Attorney may appoint [2] TWO deputy State's Attorneys and [57] 62 assistant State's Attorneys. The deputy State's Attorneys and assistant State's Attorneys serve at the pleasure of the State's Attorney.
- (3) The annual salary of the deputy State's Attorneys shall be within the discretion of the State's Attorney, but may not exceed [\$86,500] \$96,000 \$90,000. The salaries are to be paid by the County on the certification of the State's Attorney to the County Executive and County Council.
- (4) The annual salary of the assistant State's Attorneys shall be within the discretion of the State's Attorney, but may not exceed [\$77,850] \$89,000 \$81,000. The salaries are to be paid by the County on the certification of the State's Attorney to the County Executive and County Council.
