(i) "Program recipient" means an individual who receives benefits under the Program.

- (A) IN THIS SECTION, "EMERGENCY SERVICE TRANSPORTER" MEANS A PUBLIC ENTITY OR VOLUNTEER FIRE, RESCUE, OR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE THAT PROVIDES EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.
- (B) IF AN EMERGENCY SERVICE TRANSPORTER CHARGES FOR ITS SERVICES AND REQUESTS REIMBURSEMENT FROM THE PROGRAM, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REIMBURSE THE EMERGENCY SERVICE TRANSPORTER, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$100 PER TRANSPORT, FOR THE COST OF:
- (1) TRANSPORTATION THE EMERGENCY SERVICE TRANSPORTER PROVIDES TO A PROGRAM RECIPIENT TO A FACILITY IN RESPONSE TO A 911 CALL; AND
- (2) MEDICAL SERVICES THE EMERGENCY SERVICE TRANSPORTER PROVIDES TO THE PROGRAM RECIPIENT WHILE TRANSPORTING THE PROGRAM RECIPIENT TO A FACILITY IN RESPONSE TO A 911 CALL.
- (C) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 1998, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT ANY REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THIS SECTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before January 1, 1999, the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene shall adopt any regulations necessary to carry out § 15-114.1 of the Health General Article as enacted under Section 1 of this Act.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take effect October 1, 1998.

SECTION 2-4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in Section 3 of this Act, this Act shall take effect October 1, 1998 July 1, 1999.
