

(B) (1) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SHALL BE THE CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER FOR THE CORPORATION AND AS SUCH SHALL DIRECT AND SUPERVISE THE ADMINISTRATIVE AFFAIRS AND TECHNICAL ACTIVITIES OF THE CORPORATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH POLICIES AND PROCEDURES ESTABLISHED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

(2) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OR THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S DESIGNEE SHALL:

(I) ATTEND ALL MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS, ACT AS SECRETARY TO THE BOARD, AND KEEP MINUTES OF ALL ITS PROCEEDINGS;

(II) APPROVE ALL ACCOUNTS FOR SALARIES, PER DIEM PAYMENTS, AND ALLOWABLE EXPENSES OF THE CORPORATION OR OF ANY OF ITS EMPLOYEES OR CONSULTANTS, AND ANY EXPENSES INCIDENTAL TO THE OPERATION OF THE CORPORATION; AND

(III) PERFORM ANY OTHER DUTIES AS DIRECTED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS IN CARRYING OUT THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBTITLE.

(C) THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL APPOINT ANY ADDITIONAL PROFESSIONAL AND CLERICAL STAFF NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBTITLE. THE OFFICERS OR EMPLOYEES OF THE CORPORATION ARE NOT SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF DIVISION I OF THE STATE PERSONNEL AND PENSIONS ARTICLE THAT GOVERN THE STATE PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM.

(D) THE ATTORNEY GENERAL SHALL PROVIDE LEGAL COUNSEL TO THE CORPORATION AND LEGAL SERVICES TO THE MUSEUM.

(E) THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MAY ENGAGE ANY NECESSARY ACCOUNTANTS, ARCHITECTS, CONSTRUCTION EXPERTS AND PERSONNEL, ENGINEERS, LAWYERS, FINANCIAL ADVISORS, OR OTHER CONSULTANTS OR AGENTS.

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THE CORPORATION MAY:

(1) ADOPT AND ALTER AN OFFICIAL SEAL;

(2) SUE AND BE SUED, PLEAD AND BE IMPEADED, IN ITS OWN NAME;

(3) MAINTAIN OFFICES AT A PLACE OR PLACES WITHIN THE STATE THAT IT DESIGNATES;

(4) APPOINT MUSEUM ADVISORY BOARDS AND OTHER ADVISORY BOARDS AND COMMITTEES AS IT DEEMS APPROPRIATE;

(5) ADOPT BYLAWS FOR THE REGULATION OF ITS AFFAIRS AND THE CONDUCT OF ITS BUSINESS;

(6) APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT ANY GRANTS, LOANS, OR ASSISTANCE OF ANY CHARACTER FROM THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, STATE GOVERNMENT, ANY LOCAL GOVERNMENT, OR ANY PRIVATE SOURCE;
