

(2) The corporation does not forfeit its right to do intrastate business under the laws of this State; and

(3) If the corporation qualifies or changes its name after June 1, 1951, the name of the corporation complies with the requirements of Title 2 of this article relating to corporate names.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1998.

CHAPTER 445

(House Bill 84)

AN ACT concerning

State Board of Barbers - Qualifications of Applicants for Licensure

FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Board of Barbers to provide a certain credit for individuals who complete certain barber training in a detention center or correctional facility under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the qualifications of an applicant for a barber license.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Business Occupations and Professions

4-302.

(b) (1) An applicant for a barber license shall have completed successfully:

(i) a required program of at least 1,200 hours of training in a barber school that is approved by the State Department of Education or the Maryland Higher Education Commission, in consultation with the Board; or

(ii) an apprenticeship of at least 2,250 hours within 2 years in a barbershop that holds a barbershop permit under the supervision of a master barber.

(2) If the applicant for a barber license is an individual trained and currently licensed as a cosmetologist in the State, the Board shall:
