member, has met a suitable standard of physical examination before becoming a fire fighter, fire fighting instructor, rescue squad member, or advanced life support unit member.

- (d) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, any paid fire fighter, paid fire fighting instructor, SWORN MEMBER OF THE OFFICE OF THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL, paid police officer, or any deputy sheriff of Montgomery County or Prince George's County who is eligible for benefits under subsection (a), (b), or (c) of this section shall receive the benefits in addition to any benefits that the individual is entitled to receive under the retirement system in which the individual was a participant at the time of the claim.
- (2) The benefits received under this title shall be adjusted so that the weekly total of those benefits and retirement benefits does not exceed the weekly salary that was paid to the fire fighter, fire fighting instructor, SWORN MEMBER OF THE OFFICE OF THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL, police officer, or deputy sheriff.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1998.

(House Bill 89)
