

(4) Notwithstanding paragraph (1) of this subsection, a court may not stay the entering of judgment and place a person on probation for a violation of any of the provisions of §§ 462 through 464B of this article for an offense involving a person under the age of 16 years.

(5) By consenting to and receiving a stay of entering of the judgment as provided by this subsection, the person waives the right to appeal from the judgment of guilt by the court at any time. Prior to the person consenting to the stay of entering of the judgment, the court shall notify the person that by consenting to and receiving a stay of entry of judgment, the person waives the right to appeal from the judgment of guilt by the court at any time.

(b) Upon violation of a term or condition of probation, the court may enter judgment and proceed with disposition of the person as if the person had not been placed on probation.

(c) Upon fulfillment of the terms and conditions of probation, the court shall discharge the person from probation. The discharge is final disposition of the matter. Discharge of a person under this section shall be without judgment of conviction and is not a conviction for purposes of any disqualification or disability imposed by law because of conviction of crime.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1998.

CHAPTER 461

(House Bill 286)

AN ACT concerning

Public Schools - Integrated Pest Management

FOR the purpose of requiring county boards of education to adopt certain integrated pest management systems for public schools as approved by the Secretary of Agriculture; requiring public schools to provide certain information to certain individuals at the start of each school year; requiring county boards to designate certain contact persons for certain purposes; requiring public schools to maintain a certain pesticide notification list; requiring public schools to provide certain information to certain individuals before certain pesticide applications, subject to a certain exception; requiring public schools to provide certain information to certain individuals in a certain manner in case of an emergency pesticide application; defining certain terms; providing for the application of this Act; providing for the effective date of this Act; providing for the application and termination of a portion of this Act; and generally relating to pesticide application in schools.
