

(E) (1) THE SECRETARY OF JUVENILE JUSTICE SHALL SERVE AS THE CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMISSION.

(2) FROM AMONG ITS MEMBERS, THE COMMISSION AT ITS INITIAL ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING SHALL ELECT A VICE CHAIRMAN.

(F) THE COMMISSION SHALL MEET AT THE TIMES THAT THE CHAIRMAN DETERMINES.

(G) A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION:

(1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION; BUT

(2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

(H) STAFF SUPPORT FOR THE COMMISSION SHALL BE PROVIDED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

(I) ON SEPTEMBER 30, 2000, THE COMMISSION SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT ON THE RESULTS OF ITS INVESTIGATION AND STUDY, TOGETHER WITH ANY RESULTING POLICY RECOMMENDATIONS, TO THE GOVERNOR AND, SUBJECT TO § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of September 30, 2000, with no further action required by the General Assembly, Section 2 of this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1998.

AN ACT concerning

Juvenile Justice Act of 1998

FOR the purpose of altering the jurisdiction of the juvenile court; ~~establishing certain exceptions;~~ authorizing a criminal court to transfer certain cases to the juvenile court under certain circumstances; modifying juvenile confidentiality requirements pertaining to certain records; permitting law enforcement agencies to include certain juvenile record information in law enforcement computer information systems for certain purposes; requiring the juvenile court to report certain juvenile record information to the Criminal Justice Information System Central Repository; establishing a Commission on Juvenile Justice Jurisdiction; establishing the duties and responsibilities, membership, reporting
