**SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:**

**Article – Courts and Judicial Proceedings**

(a) The court has exclusive original jurisdiction over:

(1) A child alleged to be delinquent, in need of supervision, in need of assistance or who has received a citation for a violation; and
