- (3) CONSIDER THE IMPACT OF ANY CHANGES IN FEDERAL JUVENILE JUSTICE LAW OR JURISDICTION;
- (4) RECOMMEND AND PROPOSE FEASIBLE STRATEGIES AND AVENUES WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT, ELSEWHERE IN STATE GOVERNMENT, AND IN THE PRIVATE AND NONPROFIT SECTORS, THAT MIGHT LIMIT CRIMES AND DELINQUENT ACTS BY YOUTHFUL OFFENDERS; AND
- (5) PROVIDE ON AN ANNUAL BASIS ANY RECOMMENDATIONS FOR CHANGES TO THE JURISDICTION OF THE JUVENILE COURT.

- (9) TWO MEMBERS OF THE STATE JUDICIARY SELECTED BY THE CHIEF JUDGE OF THE COURT OF APPEALS;
- (10) TWO THREE MEMBERS OF THE SENATE OF MARYLAND SELECTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE;
- (11)  $\overline{\text{TWO } THREE}$  MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES SELECTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE; AND
- (12) THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS SELECTED BY THE SECRETARY OF JUVENILE JUSTICE:
- (I) THE CHIEF OF A POLICE DEPARTMENT IN A MAJOR METROPOLITAN-AREA OF A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE;
