## **CHAPTER 466**

(House Bill 327)

AN ACT concerning

## Allegany County - Restaurants - Sunday Sale Permits

FOR the purpose of eliminating the requirement that a restaurant certain license holders which are restaurants in Allegany County derive a certain percent of its percentage of their gross monthly revenue from the sale of food to be eligible for a Sunday sale permit for alcoholic beverages.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

11-501.

- (a) In Allegany County, any person having a license under this article may not sell intoxicating beverages between the hours of 2 a.m. and 7:00 o'clock a.m. except as provided in subsection (b), it shall be unlawful after 2:00 a.m. Sunday to sell intoxicating beverages until 7:00 o'clock a.m. Monday. However, Sunday sales when New Year's Eve or New Year's Day falls on Sunday shall be governed by § 11–402(b) of this article.
- (b) (1) In Allegany County, notwithstanding any other provisions of this subtitle, holders of Class B and Class D licenses which are restaurants as defined in paragraph (2) of this subsection, holders of Class B licenses which are issued for use in a restaurant or banquet room located within a hotel or motel as provided under § 6–201(b) of this article, and holders of Class C licenses, may, if they pay an additional fee of \$250, sell alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises only on Sunday between the hours of 1 p.m. and 2 a.m. Monday.
- (2) Except as provided for under § 6-201(b) of this article, for purposes of this subsection, in Allegany County, "restaurant" means any establishment located in a permanent building with ample space and accommodations commonly known as a
