"MOVING VIOLATION" MEANS:

(1) A MOVING VIOLATION AS DEFINED IN REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE ADMINISTRATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF ASSESSING POINTS UNDER § 16-402 OF THIS ARTICLE; OR

(2) A VIOLATION OF A SUBSTANTIALLY SIMILAR NATURE REPORTED FROM ANOTHER JURISDICTION, OTHER THAN A VIOLATION OF THE JURISDICTION'S SIZE, WEIGHT, LOAD, EQUIPMENT, OR INSPECTION PROVISIONS.

11-136.2.

"Multipurpose passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle that:

(1) Is designed primarily for carrying persons and which is constructed on a truck chassis or with special features for occasional off-road operations;

(2) Has 3 wheels; or

(3) Is of a unique design that does not clearly meet the requirements of any other class, as determined by the Administrator.

16-101.

(a) An individual may not drive or attempt to drive a motor vehicle on any highway in this State unless:

(1) [He] THE INDIVIDUAL holds a driver's license issued under this title;

(2) [He] THE INDIVIDUAL is expressly exempt from the licensing requirements of this title; or

(3) [He] THE INDIVIDUAL otherwise is specifically authorized by this title to drive vehicles of the class that [he] THE INDIVIDUAL is driving or attempting to drive.

16-103.

(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, the Administration may not issue a driver's license to any individual who is not at least 18 years old.

(b) (1) Except as provided under paragraph [(3)] (2) of this subsection, the Administration may issue a noncommercial Class B, C, or M license to an individual under the age of 18[,] if [he is at least 16 years old and has completed satisfactorily a driver's education course approved under Subtitle 5 of this title, and has completed satisfactorily 6 hours of laboratory instruction] THE INDIVIDUAL OTHERWISE QUALIFIES FOR A DRIVER'S LICENSE UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.

(2) [The individual shall be exempt from the laboratory instruction required by this subsection, though not the required classroom instruction, if:

(i) He has been licensed regularly to drive in another state for at least 6 months; and
