SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Health Occupations

8-316.

- (a) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 8-317 of this subtitle, the Board may deny a license to any applicant, reprimand any licensee, place any licensee on probation, or suspend or revoke the license of a licensee if the applicant or licensee:
- (27) Practices registered nursing or licensed practical nursing without a license before obtaining or renewing a license, including any period when the license or a temporary license of the applicant or licensee has lapsed; [or]
- (28) After failing to renew a license or after a temporary license has lapsed, commits any act that would be grounds for disciplinary action under this section[.];
- (29) PERFORMS AN ACT THAT IS BEYOND THE LICENSEE'S KNOWLEDGE; AND SKILLS, AND ABILITIES;
- (30) WHEN ACTING IN A SUPERVISORY POSITION, DIRECTS ANOTHER NURSE TO PERFORM AN ACT THAT IS BEYOND THE NURSE'S KNOWLEDGE, AND SKILLS, AND ABILITIES; OR
- (31) WHEN ACTING IN A SUPERVISORY POSITION, DIRECTS ANOTHER NURSE TO DELEGATE A NURSING TASK TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHEN THAT NURSE REASONABLY BELIEVES:
- (I) THE INDIVIDUAL LACKS THE KNOWLEDGE; <u>AND</u> SKILLS, AND ABILITIES TO PERFORM THE TASK; OR
- (II) THE PATIENT'S CONDITION DOES NOT ALLOW DELEGATION OF THE NURSING TASK.

- (C) A PERSON MAY NOT REQUIRE A LICENSEE TO PERFORM AN ACT THAT IS BEYOND THE LICENSEE'S KNOWLEDGE; AND SKILLS, AND ABILITIES.
- (D) A PERSON MAY NOT DIRECT A LICENSEE TO DELEGATE A NURSING TASK TO A NURSE WHEN THE PERSON REASONABLY BELIEVES:
- (1) THE NURSE LACKS THE KNOWLEDGE, \underline{AND} SKILLS, \underline{AND} ABILITIES TO PERFORM THE NURSING TASK; OR
- $\hspace{0.1in}$ (2) THE PATIENT'S CONDITION DOES NOT ALLOW DELEGATION OF THE NURSING TASK.
