

and the "Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility Guidelines for Buildings and Facilities" (Appendix A to 28 CFR Part 36 and 36 CFR Part 1191.1); and

(3) Include procedures for the voluntary payment of fines directly to the Administration in uncontested parking cases.

(c) The Maryland [Port Administration police force] TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY POLICE FORCE may issue citations for violations of the motor vehicle regulations adopted under this section.

(d) (1) Any person who violates a parking regulation adopted under this section is subject to a fine not exceeding \$50. A violation of a parking regulation is not a misdemeanor.

(2) Any person who violates any other regulation adopted under this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$500.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect ~~October 1~~ July 1, 1998.

**CHAPTER 515**  
**(House Bill 802)**

AN ACT concerning

**Creation of a State Debt - Baltimore City - Police Athletic League Center**

FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed ~~\$900,000~~ \$500,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore for certain acquisition, development, or improvement purposes; providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee provide and expend a matching fund; and providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:

(1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Baltimore City - Police Athletic League Center Loan of 1998 in a total principal amount equal to the lesser of (i) ~~\$900,000~~ \$500,000 or (ii) the amount of the matching fund provided in accordance with Section 1(5) below. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8-117 through 8-124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, § 22 of the Code.
