- (II) UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, A FACILITY OWNER MAY PROVIDE THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
- 1. AN ACCOUNTING OF THE FACILITY'S ECONOMIC BENEFITS PROVIDED TO THE LOCALITY WHERE THE FACILITY IS LOCATED;
- 2. THE VALUE OF DISPOSAL AND RECYCLING FACILITIES PROVIDED TO THE LOCALITY AT NO COST OR REDUCED COST;
- 3. DIRECT EMPLOYMENT ASSOCIATED WITH THE FACILITY;
- 4. OTHER ECONOMIC BENEFITS RESULTING FROM THE FACILITY DURING THE PRECEDING CALENDAR YEAR
- (5) BEGINNING JANUARY SEPTEMBER 1, 2000, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ANNUALLY SUBMIT, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, A REPORT OF THE ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN AND THE PROGRESS MADE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION TO:
  - (I) THE HOUSE ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS COMMITTEE; AND
- (II) THE SENATE ECONOMIC AND ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE.
- (6) A FACILITY OWNER IS NOT REQUIRED TO PROVIDE INFORMATION UNDER PARAGRAPH (4) OF THIS SUBSECTION THAT IS A TRADE SECRET.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1998.

## **CHAPTER 556**

(House Bill 1336)

AN ACT concerning

State Retirement and Pension System - Investment Program
Administration and Operation

FOR the purpose of repealing an exception from a certain exemption from State procurement law for certain real property that is owned and occupied by the Board of Trustees of the State Retirement and Pension System; altering, for certain fiscal years, the amount that may be estimated and paid into the expense funds of the several systems for administrative and operational expenses; extending a certain termination date that relates to a certain limitation on the amount that may be paid into expense funds of the State retirement and pension systems for administrative and operational expenses;
