Of this amount, in each fiscal year, at least \$300,000 shall be expended for tuition reimbursement or scholarships to attend classes at the Baltimore City Community College and the remaining balance shall be expended in a manner consistent with the educational mission of the Baltimore City Community College. The source of the \$600,000 is not limited to tax or fee revenues generated by the City of Baltimore.]

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1998.

CHAPTER 570

(House Bill 258)

AN ACT concerning

Higher Education - Small Community Colleges - Annual Grant

FOR the purpose of establishing a certain annual grant for certain small community colleges; providing certain exceptions during a certain period; defining a certain term; *providing for the termination of this Act*; and generally relating to annual grants for small community colleges.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Education

16-305.

(a) The formula used for the distribution of funds to the community colleges in the State shall be known as the Senator John A. Cade Funding Formula.

(b) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

(1) "Assessed valuation of real property" means assessed valuation of real property as determined for purposes of the State aid calculated under § 5-202 of this article.

(2) "Board" means:

(i) In a county that has 1 or more community colleges, the board of community college trustees for the county; or
