

BEFORE THE COUNTY GOVERNING BODY DURING NORMALLY SCHEDULED HEARINGS ON THE COUNTY'S PROPOSED BUDGET.

(J) NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTIONS (D), (F), AND (G) OF THIS SECTION:

(1) A COUNTY AND ONE OR MORE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS MAY ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT SETTING DIFFERENT TERMS OR TIMING FOR NEGOTIATIONS, CALCULATIONS, OR APPROVAL OF A TAX SETOFF; AND

(2) A COUNTY MAY GRANT A TAX SETOFF TO A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION THAT DOES NOT MAKE A REQUEST IN THE FASHION DESCRIBED IN THIS SECTION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1998.

CHAPTER 681

(House Bill 284)

AN ACT concerning

Assisted Living Programs - Resident Property

FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to adopt regulations for the management of resident property by assisted living programs; providing that certain provisions are not applicable to assisted living programs if certain regulations have been adopted; requiring the Department to report to certain committees of the General Assembly at a certain time; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to assisted living programs.
