SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 41 - Governor - Executive and Administrative Departments

(c) (1) The purpose of the Trust Fund is to receive and hold the proceeds from the sale or long-term lease of property and equipment [that results from the closure] of a Developmental Disabilities Administration facility or a Mental Hygiene Administration facility.

(2) For purposes of this section, proceeds are the gross proceeds minus the costs associated with the sale, lease, or disposition of property and equipment, as determined by the Department of General Services.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1996. [Except for the provisions of Section 2 of this Act, this Act shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of May 31, 1999, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.]

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1996. [Except for the provisions of Section 2 of this Act, this Act shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of May 31, 1999, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.]

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the provisions of this Act shall not apply to a Mental Hygiene Administration Facility located in Dorchester County.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding any other provision of law, for fiscal year 1999, general funds appropriated in connection with the Waiting List Initiative within the Developmental Disability Administration of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene that remain unexpended at the end of
