(House Bill 832)

AN ACT concerning

WSSC - System Development Charge, Compensation, and Hookups - Task Force on Privatization

PG/MC 4-98

FOR the purpose of altering the schedule for the payment of a system development charge to the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission (WSSC) for certain properties; establishing a maximum system development charge per fixture unit by a certain date; allowing for certain exceptions; limiting the amount of a certain exemption; establishing a maximum system development charge based on the number of toilets per dwelling; authorizing a change in the maximum system development charge based on the number of toilets per dwelling; limiting certain increases in WSSC employee compensation in a certain manner; allowing a property owner not to connect to certain water or sewerage services under certain circumstances, subject to certain exceptions; requiring certain funds to be deposited into a certain special fund; defining a term; making a stylistic change; providing for the application of a portion of this Act; establishing a Task Force on Privatization of the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission; specifying the membership, purposes, duties, and responsibilities of the Task Force; requiring the Task Force to hire an independent consultant for certain purposes; requiring the Task Force to prepare and submit certain reports to certain persons by certain dates; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the system development charge by, and the study of privatization of, the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
