CHAPTER 734

(House Bill 1194)

AN ACT concerning

Vehicle Laws - Diplomatic Immunities and Privileges - Requirements

FOR the purpose of requiring a police officer who has probable cause to believe that a driver has committed certain violations to contact the U.S. Department of State, record certain information, and send certain copies of certain documents to the Motor Vehicle Administration if the driver displays a driver's license issued by the U.S. Department of State or otherwise claims certain immunities or privileges; requiring the Administration to file certain documents, and keep certain records or make certain notations showing certain court dispositions and vehicle accidents; requiring the Administration to send copies of certain documents to the U.S. Department of State; making the provisions of this Act severable; and generally relating to drivers who claim certain immunities or privileges under certain circumstances.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

SUBTITLE 9. DRIVERS' LICENSES - IMMUNITIES AND PRIVILEGES - REQUIREMENTS.

THIS SUBTITLE APPLIES ONLY TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO DISPLAYS A DRIVER'S LICENSE ISSUED BY THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF STATE TO A POLICE OFFICER OR WHO OTHERWISE CLAIMS IMMUNITIES OR PRIVILEGES UNDER TITLE 22, CHAPTER 6 OF THE UNITED STATES CODE WITH RESPECT TO THE INDIVIDUAL'S VIOLATION OF
