- (J) IN THE EVENT OF CONDEMNATION OF LAND UNDER AN AIRPORT PRESERVATION EASEMENT, THE CONDEMNING AUTHORITY SHALL PAY:
- (1) TO THE LANDOWNER THE FULL AMOUNT THAT THE LANDOWNER WOULD BE ENTITLED TO IF THE LAND WAS NOT UNDER EASEMENT, LESS ANY AMOUNT PAID TO THE LANDOWNER BY THE COUNTY OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION FOR THE EASEMENT, AND
- (2) TO THE COUNTY OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION, TO BE DEPOSITED INTO THE COUNTY'S OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION'S GENERAL FUND UNDER PROCRAM OPEN SPACE IN THE SAME PROPORTION THAT THE COUNTY USED PROCRAM OPEN SPACE FUNDS TO ACQUIRE THE EASEMENT, THE VALUE OF THE EASEMENT.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1998.

CHAPTER 745

(House Bill 1311)

AN ACT concerning

Dorchester County - State's Attorney - Salary

FOR the purpose of altering the salary of the State's Attorney for Dorchester County; providing that this Act does not affect the salary or compensation of the incumbent <u>or any future</u> State's Attorney for Dorchester County <u>during the term</u> <u>of office of the State's Attorney</u>; and generally relating to the salary of the State's Attorney for Dorchester County.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 10 - Legal Officials

(j) (1) In Dorchester County, the State's Attorney's salary shall be $\frac{175}{80}$ percent of the salary of a judge of the District Court of Maryland $\frac{1}{875,000}$.
