SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Health Occupations

13 - 302.

- (a) (1) To qualify for a physical therapy license, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the requirements of:
 - (i) This section; and
 - (ii) § 13-303 of this subtitle.
- (2) To qualify for a physical therapist assistant license, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the requirements of:
 - (i) This section; and
 - (ii) $\S 13-304$ of this subtitle.
 - (b) The applicant shall be of good moral character.
- (c) Except as otherwise provided in this title, the applicant shall pass the appropriate examination given by the Board under this subtitle.
- (d) The applicant shall meet any other qualifications or requirements that the Board establishes for license applicants.
- (e) (1) [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE Board shall require as part of its examination or licensing procedures that an applicant for a license to practice physical therapy or limited physical therapy demonstrate [an] WRITTEN AND oral competency in the English language.
- (2) [Graduation from a recognized English-speaking undergraduate school after at least 3 years of enrollment, or from a recognized English-speaking professional school is acceptable as proof of proficiency in the oral communication of the English language under this section] AN APPLICANT IS EXEMPT FROM ENGLISH
