- (2) To qualify for a physical therapist assistant license, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the requirements of:
  - (i) This section; and
  - (ii) § 13-304 of this subtitle.
  - (b) The applicant shall be of good moral character.
- (c) Except as otherwise provided in this title, the applicant shall pass the appropriate examination given by the Board under this subtitle.
- (d) The applicant shall meet any other qualifications or requirements that the Board establishes for license applicants.
- (e) (1) [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE Board shall require as part of its examination or licensing procedures that an applicant for a license to practice physical therapy or limited physical therapy demonstrate [an] WRITTEN AND oral competency in the English language.
- (2) [Graduation from a recognized English-speaking undergraduate school after at least 3 years of enrollment, or from a recognized English-speaking professional school is acceptable as proof of proficiency in the oral communication of the English language under this section] AN APPLICANT IS EXEMPT FROM ENGLISH LANGUAGE COMPETENCY TESTING UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION IF THE APPLICANT GRADUATED FROM A PHYSICAL THERAPY PROGRAM THAT WAS TAUGHT IN ENGLISH.
- (3) By regulation, the Board shall develop a procedure for testing individuals who because of their speech impairment are unable to complete satisfactorily a Board approved standardized test of oral competency.
- (4) If any disciplinary charges or action that involves a problem with the oral communication of the English language are brought against a licensee under this title, the Board shall require the licensee to take and pass a Board approved standardized test of oral competency.

- (a) If an applicant for a physical therapy license has been educated in physical therapy in any state, the applicant shall have:
- (1) Graduated from a physical therapy [curriculum] PROGRAM that, in the year of graduation, was approved by:
  - (i) The American Medical Association; [or]
  - (ii) The American Physical Therapy Association; [and] OR
- (III) THE COMMISSION ON ACCREDITATION OF PHYSICAL THERAPY EDUCATION; AND
