

(ii) Submits to the Board:

1. An application on the form that the Board requires; and
2. Any other document required by the Board; and

(iii) Pays to the Board the application fee set by the Board.

(2) In addition to the requirements of paragraph (1) of this subsection, to be eligible for a temporary license an applicant educated outside of any state shall have been accepted for a preceptorship.

(b) (1) A temporary license issued to a physical therapist authorizes the holder to practice physical therapy while the temporary license is effective.

(2) A temporary license issued to a physical therapist assistant authorizes the holder to practice limited physical therapy while the temporary license is effective.

(c) (1) Unless the Board revokes a temporary license, [each] A temporary license expires [60] 90 days after [the date of the next scheduled examination] ISSUANCE.

(2) If a holder of a temporary license applies for a license by examination but does not report to take the [next scheduled] examination WHEN SCHEDULED, the temporary license expires on the date of [that] THE SCHEDULED examination.

(d) The Board may[:

(1) Extend] EXTEND a temporary license to complete a preceptorship[;

or

(2) Renew a temporary license once for an additional term under subsection (c) of this section, if the holder:

(i) Otherwise meets the requirements of this section;

(ii) Submits a renewal application to the Board on the form that the Board requires; and

(iii) Pays to the Board a temporary license renewal fee set by the Board].

(e) The Board shall issue a license to replace the temporary license of a holder, if the Board receives:

(1) The passing test scores of the holder; and

(2) Any other document that the Board requires.
