RESOLVED, That the Department of Legislative Services study and, on or before November 1, 1998, submit a report to the House Economic Matters Committee and the Senate Economic and Environmental Affairs Committee on the State regulation of alcoholic beverages in Maryland and on any restrictions on business practices in the sale of alcoholic beverages by manufacturers, wholesalers, and retailers, including the direct shipment of alcoholic beverages to consumers; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the report prepared by the Department of Legislative Services shall include an analysis of the regulation of alcoholic beverages as well as business practices regarding the sale of alcoholic beverages in other states and an analysis of federal and state case law on both alcoholic beverage regulation under the antitrust laws and restrictions on the sale of alcoholic beverages; and be it further
