Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 43.

This bill alters the penalties for violation of a domestic violence order. It increases the maximum fine to \$1,000 for a first offense and for a second or subsequent offense, the maximum penalty is increased to \$2,500 or imprisonment for one year, or both.

House Bill 339, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 21, 1998, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 43.
