- (3) a health incurance contract or policy THAT provides coverage for drugs that is issued to a small employer under Subtitle 12 of this title.
- (c) This section does not apply to an insured or enrollee who is a resident of a nursing home.
- (d) (1) An entity subject to this section shall allow an insured or enrollee, if authorized by an authorized prescriber, to receive up to a 90-day supply of a maintenance drug in a single dispensing of the prescription.
- (2) THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION DO NOT APPLY TO THE FIRST PRESCRIPTION OR CHANGE IN A PRESCRIPTION FOR A MAINTENANCE DRUG THAT THE AUTHORIZED PRESCRIBER PRESCRIBES FOR THE INSURED OR ENROLLEE.
- (e) Whenever an entity subject to this section increases the co-payment for a single dispensing of a prescription in a supply in excess of 30 days, the entity shall also proportionately increase the dispensing fee to the pharmacist for the prescription.
- (F) THE PURCHASE OF A 90-DAY SUPPLY OF A MAINTENANCE DRUG MAY NOT BE LIMITED TO PURCHASE THROUGH MAIL ORDER
- (C) FOR AN ENROLLEE OF A HEALTH MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATION, THE CO-PAYMENT FOR RETAIL PURCHASE OF A MAINTENANCE DRUC MAY ONLY EXCEED THE CO-PAYMENT FOR MAIL ORDER PURCHASE OF THE MAINTENANCE DRUC BY AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$10.

Chapter 232 of the Acts of 1997

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1997. [It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of September 30, 1998, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.]

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1998.
