SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply to all policies and health benefit plans issued, delivered, or renewed in the State on or after October 1, 1998.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1998.

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 343.

This bill authorizes a victim's representative to be present at trial, or any other court proceeding, by expanding the meaning of "victim", "defendant", "representative", and "trial". The bill also expands the number of crimes that are covered under these provisions by including juvenile acts and eliminating the need for the crime to have been a crime of violence.

House Bill 500, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 12, 1998, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 343.
